After careful consideration to dissolve the Rental Voucher program, the recipients under the IHBG grant will be receiving their last rental vouchers in March 2026. During freezing temperatures, you should run warm tap at a drip to prevent pipes from freezing and bursting.

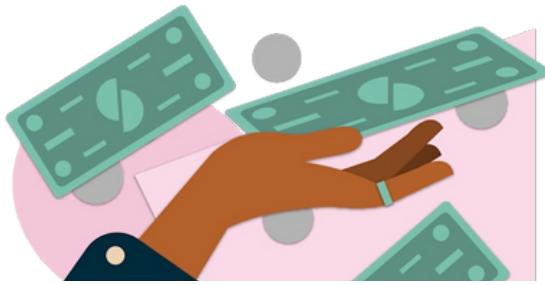
Emergencies include:
